#### 2 Summary of results


The results of the representative survey conducted by TNS Emnid on 31/01 and 01/02/2012 and analysed by the Arbeitskreis Open Government Partnership are summarised as follows:

- Almost all nationals would welcome a more open structuring of politics and the administration as well as closer consultation, thus including the significant elements of Open Government.
- All the sectors of Open Government will gain in significance in the future. Nationals see the fight against corruption as the issue gaining the most in importance, followed by participation, transparency and accountability.
- Urgent need for action in all sectors of Open Government is indicated by nationals through the differences in the valuation of importance and satisfaction.

In the fight against corruption the greatest need for action is in the criminal prosecution of misuse of authority, in participation greater consideration of nationals' proposals, in transparency the publication of the results of official food and hygiene controls and in accountability the formulation of reviewable political objectives.

# 3 Open Government: Almost all would welcome a more open structuring of politics and the administration


Would you welcome it if politics and the administration would structure their work more openly and consult more closely with nationals?



61% of respondents would gladly welcome it if politics and the administration were to structure their work more openly and consult more closely with nationals. A further 35% would rather welcome more open governance. On the whole, "Open Government" is agreed on by 96% or almost all.

#### 4 Open Government: All sectors gain in importance

Do you believe that the following will become more important, less important or remain unchanged in the future?




In the view of nationals, all the sectors of Open Government will gain in significance in the future. In the fight against corruptions 66% agree, in participation (participation by nationals) 63% agree, in transparency 54% agree and in accountability (reporting on the performance of politics and the administration) 53% agree.

#### 5 Open Government: Urgent need for action in all sectors




An urgent need for action exists in all sectors of Open Government. This is confirmed by more than half of the nationals who said that the individual aspects surveyed were very important or important; at the same time, less than 50% said that they were very satisfied or satisfied with the surveyed aspects. Therefore, in order to achieve a "balance" between importance and satisfaction, the performance of politics and the administration must be urgently improved in all sectors of Open Government.

## 6 Fight Against Corruption: Greatest need for action is in the criminal prosecution of misuse of authority


How important are the following to you? And how satisfied are you with them?



95% of surveyed nationals regard it as important that office bearers who misuse their positions must expect consequences under criminal law. In contrast, only 22% are satisfied with the penalties under criminal law for the misuse of authority. This results in a difference of 73% between importance and satisfaction. The differences or needs for action were lower for the regulations and measures to fight corruption in politics and the administration (69%) as well as for information on the extent of corruption, misuse of authority and gaining personal benefits (63%).

## 7 Participation: Greatest need for action is in the consideration of nationals' proposals

How important are the following to you? And how satisfied are you with them?




In participation, the greatest need for action for the state and the public administration is for greater consideration of nationals' proposals. 92% of respondents stated that this aspect of participation was very important to them or more important; however only 29% were very satisfied or more satisfied with the consideration of nationals' proposals. This results in a difference of 63% between importance and satisfaction. The difference, and thereby the need for action, is the same for the options to influence political decisions at an early stage.

It is noteworthy that the consideration of proposals for political decisions takes on ever greater importance. This can be seen from a comparison of the results of the representative survey that TNS Emnid conducted on 16/06/2010 on behalf of the German foundation, the Bertelsmann Stiftung.<sup>1</sup> To the question of what would have to change so that the respondents would engage themselves to a greater extent politically, only 74% (compared to the above 92%) stated that their opinion would have to be considered and taken seriously.

## 8 Transparency: Greatest need for action is in the publication of food and hygiene controls

How important are the following to you? And how satisfied are you with them?



In the area of transparency, nationals see the greatest need for action in the publication of the results of official food and hygiene controls. 94% of respondents said that publication was very important to them or more important. In contrast, only 41% were very satisfied or more satisfied with the publication of control data. The difference between importance and satisfaction is thus 53%. In the publication of all the income and expenses of political parties this difference was 52%, i.e. almost as high. In the publication of all the secondary income of politicians as well as in the publication of data on environmental pollution, the difference of 49% between importance and satisfaction is only slightly lower.

A comparison of the results of the representative survey conducted by the opinion research institute, Forsa, from the 14<sup>th</sup> to the 18<sup>th</sup> of June 2010 shows that interest in the results of official



food and hygiene controls in recent times has clearly increased.<sup>2</sup> In this survey, 59% of German nationals surveyed stated that they were "very interested" in the relevant control data. In the present survey the percentage of those for whom the publication of control data was "very important" was clearly higher at 65%.

## 9 Accountability: Greatest need for action is in the formulation of reviewable political objectives

How important are the following to you? And how satisfied are you with them?



The greatest need for action in the area of accountability of the state and the public administration is in the formulation of reviewable political objectives. This aspect was regarded as very important or more important by 93% of respondents. Very or more satisfied with a definition of objectives are however only 24%. This results in a difference of 69% between importance and satisfaction. In the options of reviewing politicians for keeping their election promises (67%), independent controls to measure the success of political actions (60%) as well as in the options of reviewing the performance of the public administration and comparing it with the performance of other administrations (55%) the differences, and thereby the needs for action, were somewhat lower.

The Arbeitskreis [Working Group] is an open collaboration of civil society organisations and interested individuals. It unites experts from the most important dimensions of Open Government. The members of the Working Group are united in the common conviction that participation by the Federal Republic of Germany in the Open Government Partnership will result in a long term culture change for more transparency, participation of nationals and thereby a reduction in the disenchantment with politics.
